

Leadership Team Explained

The Gospellers' Leadership Team (LT) meets electronically (via Google Hangout) at 7pm on the first Tuesday of each month. We also meet face-to-face several times a year. Basically, the LT functions like a local congregation's Council/Cabinet. As such, we...

Plan/lead trips & workshops. This always starts by discerning how each opportunity connects to the Gospellers' mission and goals. Insights from hosts, choir members, past experiences, and Anina Travel help us craft an itinerary with space for rest, fellowship, and spontaneous "Spirit sightings."

Nurture relationships. This includes responding to inquiries, communicating with partners, keeping the WI Conference UCC informed, and reaching out to potential collaborators such as the <u>Lord'n'Joy</u> and <u>Gospel & More</u> choirs. In addition, we often lead devotions, encourage fellowship, and hold space for God's still-speaking voice.

Manage finances. The Gospellers have both checking and savings accounts, and maintain 501c3 status through the Wisconsin Conference UCC. Free-will offerings and annual dues help us compensate professional musicians, purchase music & supplies, offer travel scholarships, and steward previously-raised funds.

Encourage recruitment. Most new Gospellers tell us they joined the choir after receiving a personal invitation. So while the LT creates & sends concert flyers and general invitations, we need you to spread the word.
