Is language a problem? No. Hosts speak some English. Martin & Kimberly translate as needed.


What can I do to help?

ORDINARY TIME?!?

Per the church calendar, we're in "Ordinary Time." This time of year, my ordinary includes fresh, local corn. My Catholic & Anglican classmates tell me that "ordinary time" is actually a mid 20th century translation of the Latin *tempus per annum*. A more literal translation would be "time during the year."

The other seasons of the church year all anticipate, celebrate or remember *particular events* (Catholics would say "mysteries") in Jesus' life. They include specific rituals. Think Christmas, Easter, Pentecost, etc. In contrast, *tempus per annum* doesn't really include flashy symbols, miracles, or special foods. *Tempus per annum* draws attention to God's presence in our everyday—in our routines & ordinary lives.

But WHY? I can think of at least 3 reasons:

- To allow God into our routines. Yes, God is already there.
 But do we welcome that? Or would we rather confine the miracles to Easter, Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, and (maybe) Lent?
- 2. To (re)acknowledge how we distract ourselves from the Spirit's everyday presence. Doom scrolling, busy-ness, catching up, "getting ahead," or "getting away from it all."
- 3. Our everyday selves are more honest than our spit-shined, feast day selves.
- 4. These everyday practices strengthen our faith. In *Oklahoma!*,

 Laurey is upset because getting married (celebration) didn't end her troubles, didn't free her from worry. Aunt Eller replies, "Oh, lots of things happen to folks. Sickness or being poor and hungry, being old and afeared to die. That's the way it is, cradle to grave, and you can stand it..."

When do we learn to reach for God when the things of life happen? Ordinary Time.
